Journalists from across the world have discovered Lolland.

On the 11th of June, Baltic Sea Solutions received a visit from 4 South African journalists who came to Denmark to write an article about Denmark's role in International Climate Issues. The official visit was arranged by the Danish Foreign Ministry and Baltic Sea Solutions and started with a trip to Lolland to see "best practise" examples.

Denmark is in the global limelight in connection with UN's climate conference (COP15) next year. Journalists from all over the world are coming to Denmark to see how strategic visions regarding sustainable energy are realised. When we receive delegations from abroad, we are not only ambassadors for our own company and the Municipality, but for the whole all Denmark, says Lotte Jespersen from Baltic Sea Solutions, who coordinates and arranges the visits on Lolland.

Silvia Magnoni from Baltic Sea Solutions and Leo Christensen from the Lolland Municipality hosted the South African visitors and showed them Lolland "Community Testing Facilities" (CTF). The trip took them amongst others to the Wind Park "Rødsand" and Nakskov Industrial and Environmental Park (NIMP).
